

## **Twentieth Sunday after Pentecost**

**October 10, 2021**

**As We Gather** - God's people are called to live each hour of the day following the example set by Jesus. Many Christian people find opportunity for personal devotion at the beginning of the day or as the day draws to its close. Yet all day long there are occasions for praying, praising, and giving thanks. In the formal worship sequence observed in structured Christian communities such as monasteries, a noontime service called Sext, named for noon—the sixth hour of the day, provided a midpoint for a day filled with devotion. The psalmist affirms that every hour is a good hour to bless the Lord, writing: "My tongue shall tell of Your righteousness and of Your praise all the day long" (Psalm 35:28).

### **SOME CHANGES FOR SAFETY SAKE**

**Worship Cards:** Please fill out a Registry of Worship Card found in the pew racks. We ask that you print the names of every person in your family, indicating if they take communion. Please keep a six foot space between you, including other members of your immediate family, and others. This includes spaces in the pew as well as spaces between the pews. For example, if you are sitting directly behind someone, you are closer than six feet.

**The Wearing of Masks** – Mask are no longer required for those who are fully vaccinated, although we welcome their use to aid in the comfort of others. We ask that unvaccinated people continue to wear masks. We continue to encourage social distancing and frequent hand washing. Those who are sick should stay home. Thank you.
