# DON'T FORGET BAGS FOR TALBOT HOUSE —

Thank you to all of you who continue to support this ministry! Talbot House does extraordinary things to help the homeless. We are blessed to share in that ministry! Their doors are open to both men and women and they provide meals, shelter, & clothing, and direct them to medical care as needed. We collect offerings of canned goods-meat, vegetables, fruit, soup, paper goodspaper towels, toilet paper, napkins; cleaning supplies; soapdishwashing, personal soap, laundry; toothbrushes & toothpaste. We also collect gently used clothes -free from stains, and have working zippers and buttons. There are especially marked baskets in the mail room at the back of the church to place your offerings. Our pickup day is the second Tuesday of every month. We also have a box on top of the table where you may place unused medicines, empty pill bottles, and unopened bottles of over the counter medicines. Talbot House uses the empty pill bottles to measure out soap and shampoo for the residents. Please remove labels from the empty bottles.

## From the Pastor.....

Save us from this hour?

"Now is my soul troubled. And what shall I say? 'Father, save me from this hour'? But for this purpose I have come to this hour.... Now is the judgment of this world; now will the ruler of this world be cast out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to my-self" (John 12:27, 31-32 ESV).

The world can be a scary place. As I write this, Russia's invasion of Ukraine, with its horrific human rights violations, threatens a wider spread of death and destruction. The threat of the use of nuclear weapons is real. With Jesus, many of us can state that "my soul is troubled." An individual is tempted to say, "Father, save me from this hour." And yet, we know that until Christ returns there will be wars and rumors of wars. We know that, as Saint Paul says, "we are considered to be sheep to be slaughtered" (Romans 8:36). We know that we "walk through the valley of the shadow of death" (Psalm 23) from time to time. The comfortable lifestyle that we have enjoyed for decades might be coming to an end. But we need not despair. We have Jesus.

The good news is that Jesus went to cross and grave for you and me. The good news is that by His death, He destroyed death. The good news is that Jesus endured Good Friday so that we may be carried with Him to Easter Sunday. In a world that can seem hopeless, we have a sure and certain hope. Jesus tells us amid the violence of this world: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid" (John 14:27).

#### Our Seminarian

For many years, our congregation has supported men studying to become pastors in our Synod. Most denominations that have seminaries have students studying for two or three years and then graduation. Lutheran seminaries of all stripes are the exception. All are four year. Lutheran seminaries are two years of on campus study. Followed by a third year off-campus internship. This is also known as vicarage. Then return for a fourth year on campus study before graduating and becoming certified for ordination. The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod has two seminaries. Both are named Concordia Seminary. One is in Fort Wayne, Indiana. One is in St. Louis, Missouri.

Christ Lutheran Church connected with Concordia Seminary in St. Louis with a program called "adopt a student." We asked to support a person with whom we can identify and share in his joys and sorrows during his four-years of study. Last year, Concordia Seminary gave us a student to follow for four years. His name is Caleb Wehling and his wife Alicia. We share their joys and their sorrows.

This year Caleb is a second-year seminarian. Next year he will be a Vicar. Vicarage Assignment Day is April 26. On that day, Caleb and Alicia will know where they will go and live and serve for one year. Usually a LCMS vicarage is somewhere in the United States or Canada. Our prayer is that the vicarage year will be an exciting one and in a place where they both will enjoy. Then Vicar Caleb and Alicia will return to Concordia St. Louis for a final fourth year of study after which he will be ordained.

By the way, Grace Lutheran Church and School in Winter Haven is asking for a vicar for the Academic Year 2022-2023. Our prayer is also that they will receive a seminarian who will be able to put into practice what he has learned during his two years as an on-campus seminarian.

Christ Lutheran Church financially supports our "adopted seminarian." We send the seminary \$500 a year to help Caleb Wehling cover the costs of attending the seminary for one year. We divide our gift in half: \$250 for the fall semester and \$250 for the spring semester. [It costs each seminarian over \$28,000 a year to attend Concordia Seminary.]

The LCMS has a shortage of pastors. There are places where congregations have to merge or become a 2 or 3-point parish to have a pastor. Our prayer is that the Lord will lead more men to accept the Call to study to become pastors.

Buy One Get One. We love going to the grocery store and get a bargain. We pick up two and pay for one. One is free. Sometimes, we look at the store item and say that we don't need two and skip the BOGO and leave the second one behind.

The next time you go grocery shopping, think about the food pantry. Do a BOGO and let the second one be your donation to the food pantry. What a deal! You can help someone without taking the cost of the food item out of your monthly social security check. With the high price of groceries, it is hard to share. Buy One and Get One **Free.** What a deal!

Think about the person who receives your BOGO. He/she can't afford to purchase what you just picked up. This is why that person or that family is at the food pantry. [Matthew 25:35] Jesus said, "For I was hungry, and you gave Me something to eat. I was thirsty, and you gave Me something to drink." We will say, [Matthew 25:37] "Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You a drink?" And Jesus will say, [Mt 25:40] "...when I say that every time you did something for one of these brothers of Mine, even the least important ones, you did it for Me." [Julian G. Anderson Translation.]

Christ Lutheran Church does not operate a food pantry. Why? Because Talbot House has an excellent food distribution program. They do a wonderful job of vetting people. Often these people are then encouraged to receive other programs that Talbot House offers such as medical care, job training, GED, transportation help, child care, housing, and the list goes on and on.

The next time you go grocery shopping, think about what you can do for "the least important ones" and you will be BOGO shopping for our Lord Jesus Christ Himself.
