DON'T FORGET BAGS FOR TALBOT HOUSE —

Thank you to all of you who continue to support this ministry! Talbot House does extraordinary things to help the homeless. We are blessed to share in that ministry! Their doors are open to both men and women and they provide meals, shelter, & clothing, and direct them to medical care as needed. We collect offerings of canned goods-meat, vegetables, fruit, soup, paper goodspaper towels, toilet paper, napkins; cleaning supplies; soapdishwashing, personal soap, laundry; toothbrushes & toothpaste. We also collect gently used clothes -free from stains, and have working zippers and buttons. There are especially marked baskets in the mail room at the back of the church to place your offerings. Our pickup day is the second Tuesday of every month. We also have a box on top of the table where you may place unused medicines, empty pill bottles, and unopened bottles of over the counter medicines. Talbot House uses the empty pill bottles to measure out soap and shampoo for the residents. Please remove labels from the empty bottles.

The Fashion Show planned for February has run into scheduling conflicts. The ladies presenting the fashions will be contacted for alternate dates. We reviewed our new Mary-Martha booklets. Team I will be up for the next funeral. We decided to table the scrip program for now due to continued problems. We donated \$50 to the Endowment Fund in memory of Joyce Blackwell. The ladies thanked Pastor Munz for making the Christmas ornament box. Pastor Hazzard spoke briefly about the survey upcoming and Rev. 7:9 project. The meeting closed with prayer.

Cleaning Day

Our next Mary-Martha meeting is October 12 in the Fellowship Hall at 9 with light refreshments, followed by business. Everyone is asked to bring a sack lunch. We then will clean the kitchen, the pantry, and the small kitchen. Many hands will make light work! If you aren't a member of Mary-Martha, but would like to help, come around 11. We haven't done this project in over two years, so it's time to do it again. PLEASE: the church needs us to do this deep cleaning!

For the month of August our actual income performance is \$19,960 with our YTD at \$175,635. Our actual July expenses were \$31,208 with our YTD expenses at \$203,393. Our total bank asset balance is at \$311,550. Dedicated funds are \$197,822 and undedicated bank funds are at \$113,727. The Stewardship reports our total church income is about 1.2% higher this year than in 2021 at the end of August. There were no noteworthy income items or increase in assets for this month. There are six noteworthy expenses of \$1,000 for LCEF for down payment on Courtyard study, \$1,000 for both Levi Hazzard and Sicheri for Arndt & Anonymous scholarships, \$1,193.81 for freight shipment to Central America to Carlos Orellana, \$1,800 for continuing education to Victor Hippe for Pastor Hazzard, \$1,900 for two flower stands to Tonini Church Supply.

Church Financial Secretary: Diane Bickart

The donation balances for August 2022 were \$16,188 and for 2021 they were \$20,454.74 which was \$4,266.74 decrease than August last year. 2022 has started off by having an increase of \$2,618 in contributions over 2021.
