## Nineteenth Sunday after Pentecost October 16, 2022

**As We Gather -** Although the Old Testament Reading and Gospel teach us about our prayer life, the Epistle goes beyond our conversation with God to His grace in time and eternity. Paul calls Scripture God-breathed and thereby reminds us of the breath of God in creation, Jesus' breathing on the disciples on Easter, and the clear witness that Scripture gives about our Savior. In this truth, we find confident hope that God hears our prayers. Today's Readings provide examples of prayer: Jacob receives a greater blessing than he expects, and a woman in Jesus' parable obtains justice in her persistence. But prayer does not really start with our request; it is always a response to God's grace and mercy revealed in the God-breathed Scriptures and known by faith in our Savior. We now hear that Word and respond with our brothers and sisters in confident peace and joy.
