DON'T FORGET BAGS FOR TALBOT HOUSE —

Thank you to all of you who continue to support this ministry! Talbot House does extraordinary things to help the homeless. We are blessed to share in that ministry! Their doors are open to both men and women and they provide meals, shelter, & clothing, and direct them to medical care as needed. We collect offerings of canned goods-meat, vegetables, fruit, soup, paper goods-paper towels, toilet paper, napkins; cleaning supplies; soap-dishwashing, personal soap, laundry; toothbrushes & toothpaste. We also collect gently used clothes -free from stains, and have working zippers and buttons. There are especially marked baskets in the mail room at the back of the church to place your offerings. Our pickup day is the second Tuesday of every month. We also have a box on top of the table where you may place unused medicines, empty pill bottles, and unopened bottles of over the counter medicines. Talbot House uses the empty pill bottles to measure out soap and shampoo for the residents. Please remove labels from the empty bottles. A special request for this month is for holiday food donations. Large containers of spices, flour, and sugar are real blessings.

Sundays at 8:30 a.m. (in-person); Wednesdays at noon (hybrid)

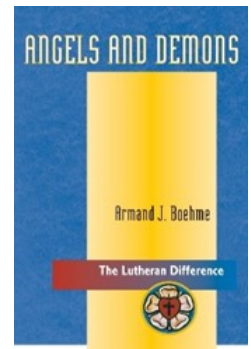
(No Bible study Christmas Day or December 28th)

The mission of the REV7:9 initiative is to inspire and equip pastors, leaders, and congregations to reach every nation, tribe, peoples, and language by identifying, producing, and encouraging the use of resources that will equip congregation members in outreach efforts to ethnically diverse community members. REV7:9 will cluster groups of leaders, congregations and their teams for education, sharing experiences and mutual support through small group triads and coaching.

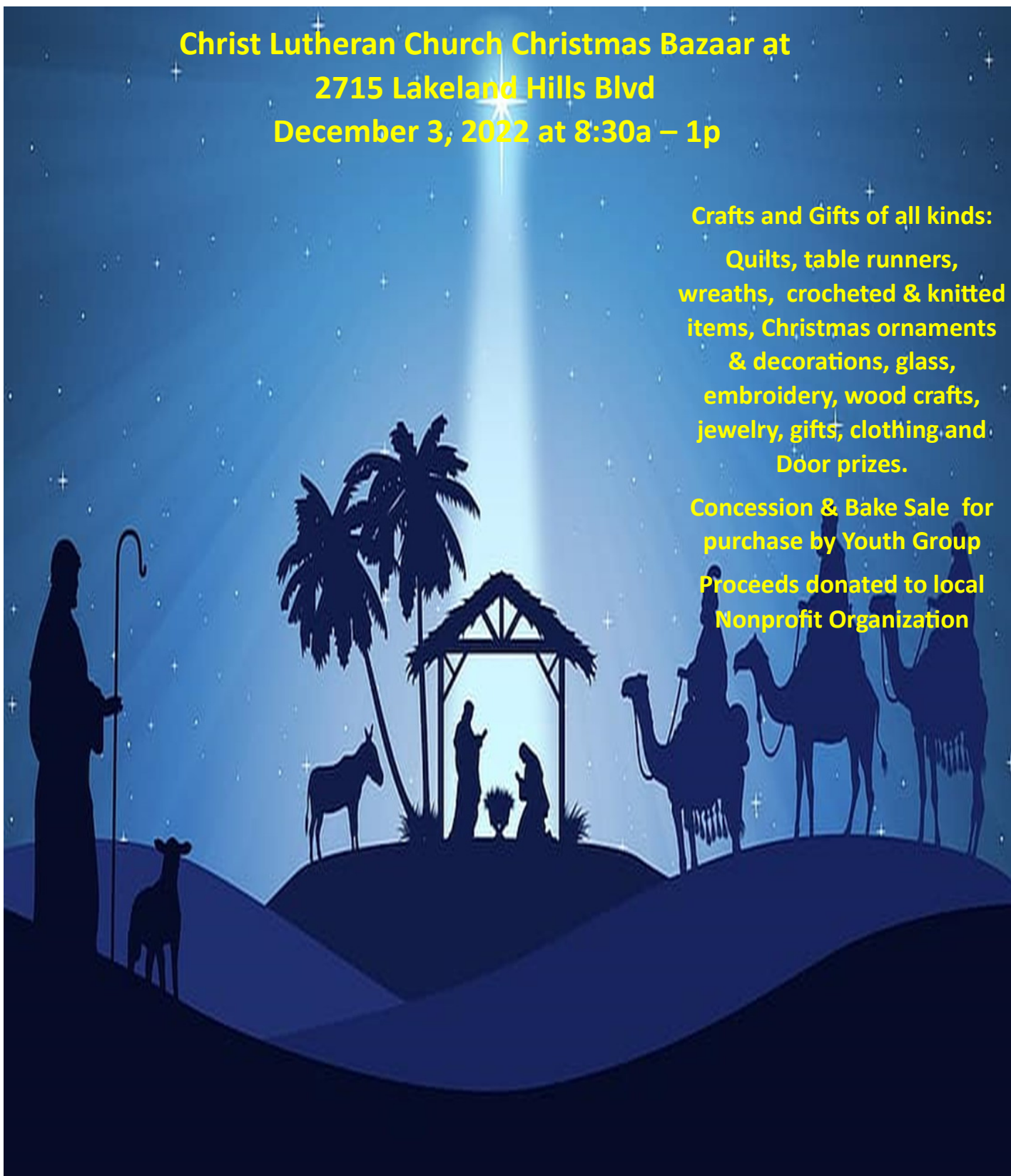

Christ Lutheran Church Council Meeting in a Nutshell
By Robin Fox, Council Secretary, October 10, 2022

For the month of September our actual income performance is \$15,124 with our YTD at \$190,756. Our actual September expenses were \$33,208 with our YTD expenses at \$203,393. Our total bank asset balance is at \$291,221. Dedicated funds are \$195,356 and undedicated bank funds are at \$95,863. The Stewardship reports our total church income is about 0.4% higher this year than in 2021 at the end of September. There were one noteworthy income items or increase in assets for this month. There are six noteworthy expenses of \$4,675 to AAA Concrete & Stucco for driveway replacement; \$4,447 to Central Music for organ and electronic repair; \$1,005 to IRS for employees FICA, Medicare and Federal Withholding taxes; \$1500 to Concordia Publishing House for 2023 Portals of Prayer; and \$5,398 to Guide One for quarterly building insurance.

Church Financial Secretary: Diane Bickart

The donation balances for September 2022 were \$17,863 and for 2021 they were \$16,702 which were \$1,161 increase than September last year.

Pastor Report: Pastor Christopher Hazzard

Christ hosting LWML Zone Rally: November 12th. Thanksgiving Eve Service, November 23rd. I attended a Revelation 7:9 orientation meeting at the Pastors' Conference. We have been working with Hi Tech Services for several weeks working on the audio in the church and for streaming. It is still not where we want it but is getting better. The owner of Hi Tech was hit hard by Hurricane Ian, so it might be a few weeks before he can get back in to help us. The surge protection and UPS has been ordered and will hopefully be in within a couple of weeks. We will then schedule with the electrician to install it all at one time. Maria and Josiah Hazzard have started learning about the streaming in order to give Robin and I coverage when we are out. We are still looking for volunteers. We are still working on the website, but there have been a lot of improvements and updates, with more to come. Best Buy contacted me in September and gave the church a \$2460 store credit for the Mac computer that crashed in June. I used some of that money to purchase a new, and more suitable, Mac Mini-computer and the components needed to replace that computer. There is still over \$1000 left in store credit left at Best Buy.

Trustee Report: Sandy Spanier

A switch and sensor had to be replaced in one a/c unit. The clean-up after hurricane Ian was done on Sat. 10/01. About a dozen people showed up bearing rakes, shovels, riding lawn

This is always a learning experience. Next year I will have an even bigger challenge; by the time we finish our mission in Honduras it will be time to start another one in Guatemala. May God help me.

We usually send a shipment to the orphanages close to Christmas (November). Mostly with items that can be use by the kids or the orphanages. At this point; I haven't received donations for the orphanages. We also give monetary donations for Christmas to the Friars, orphanages and a couple homes for orphan elders, so they can have a smile for Christmas. The Central American Mission doesn't have funds to do that, but my intention is to do it at any cost. I will ask for your contributions to carry on this project.

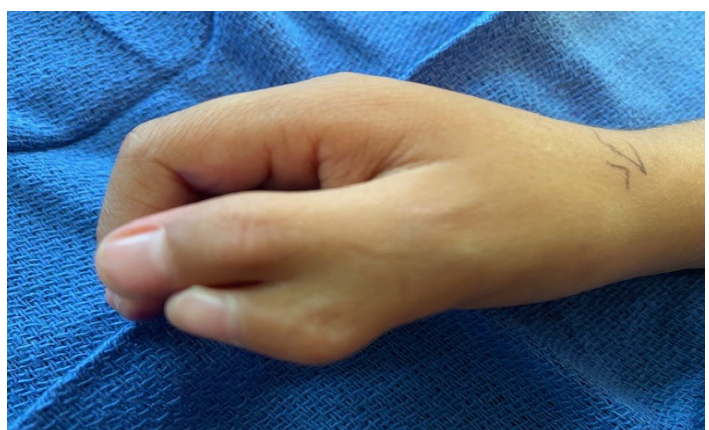
