DON'T FORGET BAGS FOR TALBOT HOUSE —

Thank you to all of you who continue to support this ministry! Talbot House does extraordinary things to help the homeless. We are blessed to share in that ministry! Their doors are open to both men and women and they provide meals, shelter, & clothing, and direct them to medical care as needed. We collect offerings of canned goods-meat, vegetables, fruit, soup, paper goodspaper towels, toilet paper, napkins; cleaning supplies; soapdishwashing, personal soap, laundry; toothbrushes & toothpaste. We also collect gently used clothes -free from stains, and have working zippers and buttons. There are especially marked baskets in the mail room at the back of the church to place your offerings. Our pickup day is the second Tuesday of every month. We also have a box on top of the table where you may place unused medicines, empty pill bottles, and unopened bottles of over the counter medicines. Talbot House uses the empty pill bottles to measure out soap and shampoo for the residents. Please remove labels from the empty bottles. A special request for this month is for holiday food donations. Large containers of spices, flour, and sugar are real blessings.



From the Pastor.....

Angels at Work in Lakeland

Angels are God's ambassador's or messengers. What messages do they bring? In the Bible texts for Advent and Christmas, we hear of the angel Gabriel telling Zechariah that his wife, Elizabeth, would conceive a son whom they are to name John. "He will turn many of the children of Israel to the Lord their God, and he will go before him in the spirit and power of Elijah... to make ready for the Lord a people prepared" (Luke 1:16-17 ESV). Gabriel also placed the Word of God in Mary, saying "behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus" (Luke 1:31 ESV). Once Jesus emerged from the womb, angels appeared to the shepherds:

And the angel said to them, "Fear not, for behold, I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among those with whom he is pleased!" (Luke 2:10-14 ESV).

While the Bible usually uses the word "angel" to describe spiritual beings, human beings are also occasionally described as angels/ambassadors/messengers. Note that the good news of Jesus' birth brings great joy to ALL the people. Is there someone that you know that could use some joy? Consider being an angel in their life by inviting them to worship on Christmas Eve or Christmas Day to hear the angel's message that brings great joy. "Go tell it on the mountain that Jesus Christ is born!"



The Blue Christmas service is a time when we can, in company with each other, acknowledge the sadness we feel at Christmas time. This is the time of the shortest day and longest night of the year, when memories of past experiences and the pain of present reality can become overwhelming. Recognizing that this is not a season of joy for everyone, in this service we will be invited to reflect on the pain, the loneliness, and the sorrow we may feel and offer it all to our great sign of hope, the Holy Child of Bethlehem. We pray that all of us will find hope and comfort in knowing that we are not alone.

Jesus, the Light

Are you waiting for something that seems to be too long in coming? Maybe it's a job promotion or a raise. Maybe it's just employment of any kind! Perhaps you've been praying for someone's salvation, and you don't see any sign of God's working in that person. It's difficult to wait. People in Jesus' day were waiting for a Messiah.

in that person. It's difficult to wait. People in Jesus' day were waiting for a Messiah. It seemed, to many, that His coming was long overdue, but Paul writes in Galatians 4:4-5, "When the time had fully come, God sent His Son, born of a woman, born under law, to redeem those under the law, that we might receive the full rights of sons." Our waiting is over! The Light has come into the world!

Simeon was one who knew that "the time had fully come," and "moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts" (Luke 2:27). There he saw the Child whose parents brought him there to fulfill what the Law required of them. Simeon knew Jesus was the light. He proclaimed, "For my eyes have seen Your salvation...a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to Your people Israel" (Luke 2:30, 32).

Unfortunately, not all who were waiting for the Messiah recognized Him when He came. In John 1:4-5 we read, "In Him was life, and that life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it." Still today the darkness misunderstands the Light. Yet He continues to shine, and, as He shines, He dispels darkness.

And He calls upon us to shine also. Jesus, in the Sermon on the Mount, described a lamp that is put on a stand so that it lights up the whole house. Then He said, "In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in Heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

Talbot House

Please continue your donations of canned food-meat, vegetables, fruit, etc. Used clothing that is donated needs to be without stains, have working zippers and buttons. New socks in men and women's sizes are needed now that cooler weather is here. The things that are not covered by SNAP (food stamps) are especially needed. These include shampoo, creme conditioner, toothpaste, toothbrushes-individually wrapped, bars of soap, body lotion. Other items not covered by SNAP include cleaning and paper supplies: toilet paper, napkins, paper towels, dishwashing soap, laundry soap, all purpose cleaners, etc. These items may be placed in the mail room at the back of the church. Talbot House boxes are located on the floor to the left of the table as you face the table.

Central America Orphanage and Missions

The collection box for this mission is located UNDER the table listed above. Children and adult clothing are welcome! Adults sizes small-extra large, and any size for children's clothing.

Medications

There is a box on the table listed above where we collect old medications for Talbot House. They also appreciate any clean, empty bottles that have the label removed. Those empty bottles are used to pour out shampoo, body soap or creme rinse from larger bottles.

Hearing aids

If you have old hearing aids, and wish to donate them, please put in the Munz mail box in the mail room at the back of the church. Pastor Munz will take them to Central FL Speech and Hearing Center where they can be refurbished. If you would like a receipt, please enclose a paper with your name and address in a bag with your hearing aids.

The teams prepare a variety of foods for us to enjoy and gives us all a time to chit chat and greet old friends and make new ones! There is no charge. For many years now, Christ Lutheran has purchased Christmas gifts for the children who live at Lighthouse Ministries. This ministry is especially for moms with children. The moms go through parenting classes, financial managing classes, receive help with finding a job, and then must save money BEFORE they leave the program so they can pay a deposit on an apartment. This is an amazing ministry!

So, this year we have 22 children at Lighthouse. This is one of the highest numbers we have ever had! On the white tree as you enter the church, you will see tags. Each child has two tags on the tree. One is something the child would like, and the other is something the parent has said the child would like. We asked that all gifts be between \$20-\$25. Please return the gift-

UNWRAPPED-with the tag attached by December 11. There will be an especially decorated box for the gifts. We also need donations of gift wrap, gift tags, and scotch tape. The Outreach committee will sort the gifts, so each child's gift is in a separate bag, and then deliver them to Lighthouse. We then allow the moms to wrap their own child's present. If you prefer to make a cash donation, please use one of the special envelopes that are in the pew and mark it for Lighthouse.

We also give the children a third gift-the best of all, we think. It is either a Bible or some other religious story book-depending on the age of the child. These gifts have the child's name, the date, and that it is a gift from Christ Lutheran Church.

Christ Lutheran Church Council Meeting in a Nutshell By Robin Fox, Council Secretary, November 14, 2022

Treasure: Jon Lindstrom

For the month of October our actual income performance is \$21,076 with our YTD at \$211,833. Our actual October expenses were \$19,669 with our YTD expenses at \$256,047. Our total bank asset balance is at \$297,349. Dedicated funds are \$200,078 and undedicated bank funds are at \$97,271. The Stewardship reports our total church income is about 1.0% higher this year than in 2021 at the end of October. There were no noteworthy income items or increase in assets for this month. There were no noteworthy expense items or decrease in asset for this month.

Church Financial Secretary: Diane Bickart

The donation balances for October 2022 were \$24,824 and for 2021 they were \$20,673 which were \$4,151 increase than October last year.

Pastor Report: Pastor Christopher Hazzard

Service schedule is as follows; Mid-week Wednesday Advent services 6:30 p.m. Theme: Angels: Divine Messengers of Hope; Christ is hosting circuit pastors' meeting December 12th; December 21st: Blue Christmas Observance; December 24^{th:} Christmas Eve 6:30 p.m.; Christmas Day: 10:00 a.m.; New Year's Eve: 5:30 p.m.; New Year's Day: 10:00 a.m..

Director of Music: Council determined salary range so that recruitment appeals can be made and position can be posted. Recruitment letters sent to area music educators. I am assembling a team with the elder's permission to screen candidates.

Next phase of LCEF Mission Clarity Process is to develop a ministry plan. I am to meet with Tom Eggebrecht, November 15th. A small group will be formed to flush out the plan, with the group's work starting in January.
