

DON'T FORGET BAGS FOR TALBOT HOUSE —

Thank you to all of you who continue to support this ministry! Talbot House does extraordinary things to help the homeless. We are blessed to share in that ministry! Their doors are open to both men and women and they provide meals, shelter, & clothing, and direct them to medical care as needed. We collect offerings of canned goods-meat, vegetables, fruit, soup, paper goodspaper towels, toilet paper, napkins; cleaning supplies; soapdishwashing, personal soap, laundry; toothbrushes & toothpaste. We also collect gently used clothes -free from stains, and have working zippers and buttons. There are especially marked baskets in the mail room at the back of the church to place your offerings. Our pickup day is the second Tuesday of every month. We also have a box on top of the table where you may place unused medicines, empty pill bottles, and unopened bottles of over the counter medicines. Talbot House uses the empty pill bottles to measure out soap and shampoo for the residents. Please remove labels from the empty bottles. Large containers of spices, flour, and sugar are real blessings.

Stewardship

Have you ever thought: "I don't matter" or "What I do doesn't matter"? Maybe "I'm not an important person In anyone's life." I think we've all had thoughts like this at various times in our lives. Some more than others perhaps.

It would really help if we would 'step outside' of ourselves for a moment and see us as God sees us. The talents and abilities He has given each of us are unique and valuable to others. Think about the miracle the Gospel writers told us about with the 5 loaves of bread and 2 fish. There was likely a mom who prepared that lunch for her son that day. Just another mundane daily job she had to do. Never thinking for a moment the impact it would have later that day when thousands were able to be fed.

Each of us have daily mundane jobs that must be done. Many of us do these jobs without thinking for a moment the impact it may have to someone else. We need to allow ourselves to see us as God sees us and realize that even in the simple actions of daily life, we can positively affect someone else.

There was a woman who struggled each Sunday to prepare all her children for church. It was a struggle many of us can relate to. "Was it worth it?" she wondered? "Why do I need to go through all this effort?" "What difference would it make if I didn't go?" After church an elderly woman approached her and told her how blessed she was each week to see this woman's children. The joy they gave her filled her heart and gladdened her and how much she looked forward to seeing them each week. The effort, it turns out, wasn't necessarily only for *her* benefit!

Often what we do or don't do truly has an impact on those around us, whether we know it or not. God has you right where you are for a reason. He may or may not show you why you're there but we must trust that He has us right where He wants us.

The Dream Center that is being coordinated here at Christ Lutheran Church is a perfect example of people doing mundane jobs like folding and packing. But the impact it has on people at a later date is profound! The blessings are farreaching. Sitting in that room may seem very mundane and unimportant but if we could see the smiles and know the relief it provides to others, we would be very inspired to do it more!

I pray that each member of family here at Christ, sees their worth through the eyes of Christ and is able to know their value to the world around them. I pray that we all would seek and find more ways to use the abilities we all have for the glory of God and good of those around us.

Christian Education would like to invite you to reconnect with your Bible in a class video


series called "How to Read Your Bible" hosted by Larry Nimetz.

Songs of Ascent

Psalms 120 - 134 are called "Pilgrim Psalms" or "Songs of Ascent." They were sung by those who journeyed (and thus "ascended") to the temple for the annual feasts. Each psalm is a "step" along the journey. Psalm 120 begins the journey in a distant and in hostile surroundings; Psalm 122 pictures the pilgrim arriving in Jerusalem; and the rest of the psalms move toward the temple, mentioning various characteristics of God. Explore the goodness of our God through these passages.

Central America Missons June 2023

Our next surgical mission is in a little over a week. I need to leave June 1st. Unfortunately, my trip is on hold until I get my renewed passport from the State Department. Your prayers would be highly appreciated, but it will be in God's plan.

The help that Christ Lutheran sends to Honduras helps several orphanages in Honduras. In May, our Church sent 1600 pounds. This is a lot to be able to send. The shipping company gives me a break because of our mission. The donations were combined with medical supplies and with items to be used in the different orphanages. We help Hogar Nazareno which has three different orphanages; one for girls, one for boys, and another for special needs. There is another separate orphanage that we help, and I call it Don (Mr.) Goyo. Gregorio is a gentleman from Spain who came to Comayagua and has dedicated his life to help orphan boys in Honduras.

His approach to help these boys is very unique. He provides for the boys during the week; from education to everything they need. On weekends, he allows the boys to go see their families, if their situation allows for a safe stay. Sometimes families go through transitional crisis. This approach helps them to provide a safe environment and time to heal. By helping them, Christ Lutheran is a part of this healing process. This model is also being used at Hogar Nazareno.

Honduras also celebrates Mother's Day in May. I received newsletters from Hogar Nazareno and there were some very touching stories about girls that have grown up and become mothers themselves; how they have followed the Mother role model that they received at Hogar Nazareno. These are the success stories and Christ Lutheran is a part of it.

May God continue to bless you and may we also continue to share our blessings with others. If you are inclined to help the Central American Mission (CAM); you can place your donations in the offering plate in an envelope marked for "Honduras Mission ". We also continue to collect items that you may not need around your house. From toiletries, kitchen items, clothing etc. Place the items in the Honduras collection box in the Narthex.
