

DON'T FORGET BAGS FOR TALBOT HOUSE —

Thank you to all of you who continue to support this ministry! Talbot House does extraordinary things to help the homeless. We are blessed to share in that ministry! Their doors are open to both men and women and they provide meals, shelter, & clothing, and direct them to medical care as needed. We collect offerings of canned goods-meat, vegetables, fruit, soup, paper goods-paper towels, toilet paper, napkins; cleaning supplies; soap-dishwashing, personal soap, laundry; toothbrushes & toothpaste. We also collect gently used clothes -free from stains, and have working zippers and buttons. There are especially marked baskets in the mail room at the back of the church to place your offerings. Our pickup day is the second Tuesday of every month. We also have a box on top of the table where you may place unused medicines, empty pill bottles, and unopened bottles of over the counter medicines. Talbot House uses the empty pill bottles to measure out soap and shampoo for the residents. Please remove labels from the empty bottles. Large containers of spices, flour, and sugar are real blessings.



From the Pastor.....

Martin Luther on Holiness

In Matthew 13:33 Jesus tells us about “...the leaven which the woman mixes in three measures of meal until it is leavened through and through. The new leaven is the faith and grace of the Spirit, Who does not leaven the whole lump through at once, but gently and slowly makes us altogether like Himself, new bread of God. This life, therefore, is not righteousness but growth in righteousness, not health but healing, not being but becoming, not rest but exercise; we are not yet what we shall be, but we are growing toward it; the process is not yet finished, but it is going on; this is not the end, but it is the road; all does not yet gleam with glory, but all is being purified.” (An Argument in Defense of all the Articles of Dr. Martin Luther Wrongly Condemned in the Roman Bull, 1520. Translation C.M. Jacobs).


We are all works in progress. We do not live the Godly lives that we want to live. As St. Paul says, “For I have the desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry it out. For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing” (Romans 18b-19). And so, we often find ourselves frustrated. We lack the self-control that we think we should possess. We struggle to act upon the faith given us in Baptism. Sin is the maddening norm in our fallen world.

The good news is that we have God’s imputed holiness given to us, freely, solely by His grace and mercy on account of Christ. As Luther said, “If we believe in Christ, we are considered absolutely just for His sake, in faith. Later, after the death of this flesh, in the other life, we shall attain perfect righteousness and have within us that absolute righteousness which we have now only by imputation through the merit of Christ” (Luther, Exposition of Psalm 45:6, 1533). Until then, we possess a “...godly and holy despair which all who would be saved must confess with mouth and heart” (Luther, Exposition of Galatians 5:17, 1531). The despair drives us back to the Word of the Cross and the Word of the Gospel. God will continue to love us despite of ourselves until that day when we are freed from sinning: “When we shall finally stop lying, deceiving, stealing, murdering, robbing, committing adultery, we shall have become pious, that is, when they use the shovel to put us under the ground. For St. Paul says: ‘He that is dead is freed from sin’ (Rom 6:7)” (one of John Aurifaber’s collections of Luther’s sayings).

All over the world, Lutherans gather to worship. But what makes Lutheran worship different?

Lutheran worship is a continual conversation between God and the believer, in which we focus on Jesus, who is present with and for us through His Word and Sacrament. Through the hymns, liturgy, and prayers in the Divine Service, we receive the precious gifts our Lord desires to give us: the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation.

Worship expands on the topic from Lutheranism 101, presenting background information on the development of Lutheran worship, a deeper look at the parts of the worship service, and an understanding of why Lutheran worship is both consistent with the way Christians have worshiped over the centuries as well as a unique expression of Lutheran theology.
