### DON'T FORGET BAGS FOR TALBOT HOUSE —

Thank you to all of you who continue to support this ministry! Talbot House does extraordinary things to help the homeless. We are blessed to share in that ministry! Their doors are open to both men and women and they provide meals, shelter, & clothing, and direct them to medical care as needed. We collect offerings of canned goods-meat, vegetables, fruit, soup, paper goodspaper towels, toilet paper, napkins; cleaning supplies; soapdishwashing, personal soap, laundry; toothbrushes & toothpaste. We also collect gently used clothes -free from stains, and have working zippers and buttons. There are especially marked baskets in the mail room at the back of the church to place your offerings. Our pickup day is the second Tuesday of every month. We also have a box on top of the table where you may place unused medicines, empty pill bottles, and unopened bottles of over the counter medicines. Talbot House uses the empty pill bottles to measure out soap and shampoo for the residents. Please remove labels from the empty bottles. Large containers of spices, flour, and sugar are real blessings.



## From the Pastor.....

Sing to the Lord of Harvest

You visit the earth and water it; you greatly enrich it; the river of God is full of water; you provide their grain, for so you have prepared it. <sup>10</sup> You water its furrows abundantly, settling its ridges, softening it with showers, and blessing its growth.

<sup>11</sup> You crown the year with your bounty; your wagon tracks overflow with abundance.

<sup>12</sup> The pastures of the wilderness overflow, the hills gird themselves with joy,

<sup>13</sup> the meadows clothe themselves with flocks, the valleys deck themselves with grain, they shout and sing together for joy. (Psalm 65:9-13 ESV)

God placed Adam and Eve in the environment most suitable for human beings: a natural paradise full of diverse flora and fauna, all for the early humans' health and delight. Adam deeply observed creation and gave every living creature its' name. I think of Adam almost like an ancient John Jay Audubon (1785-1851), who set about to describe and paint every bird in America. Adam's relationship with God's natural paradise was transformed when sin entered the world, and the first humans were kicked out of the garden. We have sin to blame for weeds:

"thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you" (Genesis 3:18). And yet, even despite our sin, God continues to provide abundantly for us, His people. In Psalm 65 David notes that the pastures and the hills and the meadows and the valleys "shout and sing together for joy" as God provides His bounty. God promised his Old Testament people, "...you shall eat and be full, and you shall bless the LORD your God for the good land he has given you" (Deuteronomy 8:10, ESV). May you, too, look at God's provision in His creation and be moved to shout and sing for joy. May the Lord grant us an attitude of gratitude, that we might maintain thanksgiving in our hearts. "Sing to the Lord of harvest, Sing songs of love and praise; With joyful hearts and voices Your alleluias raise..." (LSB 893).

### Some Notes on Worship

"Our Lord speaks and we listen. His Word bestows what it says. Faith that is born from what is heard acknowledges the gifts received with eager thankfulness and praise. Music is drawn into this thankfulness and praise, enlarging and elevating the adoration of our gracious giver God.

Saying back to Him what He has said to us, we repeat what is most true and sure. Most true and sure is His Name, which He put upon us with the water of our Baptism. We are His. This we acknowledge at the beginning of the Divine Service. Where His Name is, there is He. Before Him we acknowledge that we are sinners, and we plead for forgiveness. His forgiveness is given us, and we, freed and forgiven, acclaim Him as our great and gracious God as we apply to ourselves the words He has used to make Himself known to us.

The rhythm of our worship is from Him to us, and then from us back to Him. He gives His gifts, and together we receive and extol them. We build one another up as we speak to one another in psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs. Our Lord gives us His body to eat and His blood to drink. Finally His blessing moves us out into our calling, where His gifts have their fruition. How best to do this we may learn from His Word and from the way His Word has prompted His worship through the centuries. We are heirs of an astonishingly rich tradition. Each generation receives from those who went before and, in making that tradition of the Divine Service its own, adds what best may serve in its own day the living heritage and something new." (Lutheran Worship, pg. 6, St. Louis: CPH, 1982)

### **Stewardship**

Can I Be Trusted with Much? **STEWARDSHIP** CORNER Oswald Chambers wrote, "Not every man can carry a full cup. Sudden elevation frequently leads to pride and a fall. The most exciting test of all to survive is prosperity." This quote provides a clear warning: Those who become prosperous are also very likely to become filled with pride. Pride can cause inflated egos and self-worthiness. Agur, a writer of proverbs, gave us this warning: "... give me neither poverty nor riches but give me only my daily bread. Otherwise, I may have too much and disown you and say. 'Who is the Lord?' or I may become poor and steal and so dishonor the name of my God" (Proverbs 30:8-9). When our bills are paid and we have money in the bank, we may feel secure and depend only on ourselves. In speaking about the curse of success, someone once said, "Ninety-nine people out of 100 can handle adversity whereas only one out of 100 can handle prosperity." The

God blesses us with work and the ability to earn our incomes. Unfortunately, we may foolishly begin to believe that we are solely responsible for the success we've achieved. As Moses wrote, "You may say to yourself, 'My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me.' But remember the Lord your God, for it is He who gives you the ability to produce wealth... (Deuteronomy 8:18). We should understand that only by God's grace are we able to have a place to call home, a savings account, and a retirement plan. God's Word is clear that we are managers, not owners. "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it" (Psalm 24:1).

wealth that many seek can be more of a curse than a blessing.

Even though it is difficult to pass the test with money, the Holy Spirit, working through the Word, enables us to understand that all we are and have are gifts from God. Joseph provides us a good example of stewardship. Separated from his home and family, he still trusted God and feared Him, refusing to give in to the temptations that came with the position God enable him to fill. As second in command in Egypt, one of the most powerful kingdoms of his day, he retained his humility, realizing that he was only the manager of Egypt's resources. But he managed those resources well, working at it "with all [his] heart, as working for the Lord, not for men" (Colossians 3:23). Just as God empowered Joseph in his stewardship, so He does for us today, whether our resources are vast, as were Joseph's, or small.

The Board of Stewardship would like to thank our congregation for recognizing God's great gifts and responding, in kind, back to our Lord. We are truly blessed in this church by many who give of their time, talents and treasures. Always remember: Blessings have a way of flowing to us when we allow them to flow through us! ### Central America Missions November 2023

The morning of September 13, 2023, my fourth grandson was born, coinciding with my surgical trip to Nepal. I got to meet my grandson on my way to the airport. Nepal is on the other side of the world; north of India and Southwest of China. The place where we operated was truly the end of earth. Fourteen plus hour flight from New Jersey to Dubai, plus a four hour flight from Dubai to Katmandu. From there another three hour flight to Biratnagar. From there we had another three hour bus ride up the mountains. We finally got to Dhankuta where the locals had a very elaborate reception for us. Nepali people were so grateful to have us there. Unfortunately, this is the only mission that goes there, and they only go once every two years.

We operated for two weeks with a day of rest in between. We had two sections working simultaneously. One was the main operating room where I was working. The other was the outpatient treatment. In the main OR we did 138 surgeries. Outpatient took care of 239 patients.

Our specialties were General Surgery and GYN. We also had a Proctologist who saw 205 patients in the two weeks of operation. Needless to say, everyone in our mission was busy.

This certainly was a cultural shock for me. It seems that Buddhism is the only religion there. Although, with some limited English, I talked to some locals and I gathered that there is some

form of Christianity there. I was greatly impressed by how religious they are. Especially in the mornings, I could see people doing rituals at their houses, vehicles, shrines, etc. It was everywhere. People were very friendly and crime was the least of my concerns, but always vigilant.

This was a very rewarding trip; as always is with this type of mission. I was glad to be part of this team, and thankful to God for allowing me to be helpful to others.

Keep the mission in your prayers. We have to prepare shipments for the young and adult orphanages in Honduras. Hopefully, we will be able to put smiles on the faces of the young and elderly this Christmas. Thanks to donations from the Dream Center, Christmas will look better at the orphanages.
