

DON'T FORGET BAGS FOR TALBOT HOUSE —

Thank you to all of you who continue to support this ministry! Talbot House does extraordinary things to help the homeless. We are blessed to share in that ministry! Their doors are open to both men and women and they provide meals, shelter, & clothing, and direct them to medical care as needed. We collect offerings of canned goods-meat, vegetables, fruit, soup, paper goodspaper towels, toilet paper, napkins; cleaning supplies; soapdishwashing, personal soap, laundry; toothbrushes & toothpaste. We also collect gently used clothes -free from stains, and have working zippers and buttons. There are especially marked baskets in the mail room at the back of the church to place your offerings. Our pickup day is the second Tuesday of every month. We also have a box on top of the table where you may place unused medicines, empty pill bottles, and unopened bottles of over the counter medicines. Talbot House uses the empty pill bottles to measure out soap and shampoo for the residents. Please remove labels from the empty bottles. Large containers of spices, flour, and sugar are real blessings.



From the Pastor.....

Each year, the "Cultural Christmas" season gets longer and longer. According to the church year calendar, Advent is a penitential time of fasting, prayer, reflecting sorrowfully over one's sins, and the confession of those sins. According to the church year calendar, the joyous season of Christmas lasts December 25th through January 5th, culminating in the observance of Epiphany on January 6th. According to the church year calendar, a time feasting presupposes a time of fasting. According to the **cultural** calendar, Christmas lights replace Halloween decorations in early November. SiriusXM satellite music service started streaming and broadcasting 21 stations of Christmas and "holiday" music of 21 different musical genres starting November 5th. (SiriusXM only broadcasts Christmas music the first 2 of the 12 days of Christmas, leaving me quite disappointed). I am sure that some of my neighbors will be discarding their tree(s) the evening of the 25th.

Instead of lamenting how our culture has perverted the sacred Advent and Christmas seasons, I have learned to rejoice. I rejoice that our culture has said that it is okay to talk openly about Christ for close to two months! What an opportunity to share God's Word of the real reason for the season (that actually starts December 25th): that the sinless Son of God emerged from Mary's womb to live a life of loving service, culminating in a death that destroys the power of death, and a resurrection that announces to us victory. We have opportunities to share the "... good news of great joy that will be for all the people..." "... that the Savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Luke 2:11) has been born into our world in desperate need of saving. Many who observe cultural Christmas have no idea who Jesus is and are very open to hearing the Truth. May the Lord put opportunities in place and words that you already know on your lips to share the Christmas story in its' basic, transforming form.

Jesus, the Light



Are you waiting for something that seems to be too long in coming? Maybe it's a job promotion or a raise. Maybe it's just employment of any kind! Perhaps you've been praying for someone's salvation, and you don't see any sign of God's working in that person. It's difficult to wait. People in Jesus' day were waiting for a Messiah. It seemed, to many, that His coming was long overdue, but Paul writes in Galatians 4:4-5, "When the time had fully come, God sent His Son, born of a woman, born under law, to redeem those under the law, that we might receive the full rights of sons." Our waiting is over! The Light has come into the world!

Simeon was one who knew that "the time had fully come," and "moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts" (Luke 2:27). There he saw the Child whose parents brought him there to fulfill what the Law required of them. Simeon knew Jesus was the light. He proclaimed, "For my eyes have seen Your salvation…a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to Your people Israel" (Luke 2:30, 32).

Unfortunately, not all who were waiting for the Messiah recognized Him when He came. In John 1:4-5 we read, "In Him was life, and that life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, but the darkness has not understood it." Still today the darkness misunderstands the Light. Yet He continues to shine, and, as He shines, He dispels darkness.

And He calls upon us to shine also. Jesus, in the Sermon on the Mount, described a lamp that is put on a stand so that it lights up the whole house. Then He said, "In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in Heaven" (Matthew 5:16).

The only way to dispel darkness is to fill it with light. As stewards, it is our joyous task to be reflections of Christ's light. So we are "prepared in season and out of season: [we] correct, rebuke and encourage-with great patience and careful instruction" (2 Timothy 4:2). We are always prepared "to give an answer to everyone who ask [us] to give the reason for the hope that [we] have." And we do so "with gentleness and respect keeping a clear conscience, so that those who speak

maliciously against [our] good behavior in Christ may be ashamed of their slander" (1 Peter 3:15-16). In this way we proclaim that the waiting is over! Jesus, the Light has come into the world!

Central America Missions December 2023

Now that we are approaching the end of the year it is time to think retrospectively and review our results. A lot has been done this year: five surgical missions in total plus the shipments to the orphanages and medical supplies. Next year I will keep track of the number of pounds we sent for orphanages and medical supplies, but I know we had a very productive year.

We did a surgical mission to Guatemala, three missions to Honduras, and one to Nepal. We still have a Christmas shipment to do this year. I also hope to be able to send financial donations to the kids and elderly orphanages so they can celebrate with a Christmas dinner.

The surgeries we do are performed by qualified professionals mostly from the United States and some local like in the case of Nepal. The people we serve are certainly the under privileged. Their government doesn't provide care for them, and they are unable to pay for their care.

We also help the orphanages for kids and the elderly. Unfortunately, Honduras also experiences the abandonment of the elderly. We work to support Catholic Nuns who run these charities. The kids orphanages are supervised or run by the Franciscan Friars. They run the orphanages with the purpose to reintegrate the kids to a safe environment and make them productive members of society.

I foresee increasing our work next year. There is always something new to learn, and our system is improving, making us more efficient at what we do. Keep our mission in your prayers. Thank you Christ Lutheran for your support to the Central American Mission.
