DON'T FORGET BAGS FOR TALBOT HOUSE —

Thank you to all of you who continue to support this ministry! Talbot House does extraordinary things to help the homeless. We are blessed to share in that ministry! Their doors are open to both men and women and they provide meals, shelter, & clothing, and direct them to medical care as needed. We collect offerings of canned goods-meat, vegetables, fruit, soup, paper goodspaper towels, toilet paper, napkins; cleaning supplies; soapdishwashing, personal soap, laundry; toothbrushes & toothpaste. We also collect gently used clothes -free from stains, and have working zippers and buttons. There are especially marked baskets in the mail room at the back of the church to place your offerings. Our pickup day is the second Tuesday of every month. We also have a box on top of the table where you may place unused medicines, empty pill bottles, and unopened bottles of over the counter medicines. Talbot House uses the empty pill bottles to measure out soap and shampoo for the

residents. Please remove labels from the empty bottles. Large containers of spices, flour, and sugar are real blessings.

Take it to the Lord in Prayer

Ash Wednesday, which marks the start of lent, is February 14th. Lent last for forty days, the same length of time that Jesus fasted in the desert immediately following His baptism and before the start of His public ministry. Lent is a time of repentance and spiritual renewal in preparation for Easter. We are encouraged to increase our time in Bible reading and prayer, to practice self-control through fasting, and to attend mid-week worship.

To aid in increased prayer, we are launching a more formalized prayer ministry. Spearheaded by Rita Czanko, prayer team members are being sought to pray for specific items throughout the week. Members will receive a binder with guidance, which will be prayed through throughout the week from home. Prayer team members will receive very generalized things for which to pray; this will NOT turn into an opportunity for gossip, and confidences will not be violated. Also, please pray for the pew you sit in as you attend church. If the pew has empty space, pray for the Lord to fill it.

As we do the good work of prayer, our faith grows. "Prayer must be more than an emergency measure in time of trouble; it must constantly reach out for the more abundant life promised by God" (Lutheran Cyclopedia; https://cyclopedia.lcms.org/). As we pray, we can be confident that the Lord will fulfill his promise of the more abundant life, not only our own, but our neighbor's.

For the month of December our actual performance is at a negative \$4,846 compared to the budgeted amounts. For YTD, our actual performance is at a negative \$23,758 compared to the budgeted amounts. There were no noteworthy income items this month. Central America Missions December 2023

As of this writing; I am at the Hospital San Benito Jose in Comayagua, Honduras. This is our first mission of three that I have scheduled for 2024. I came a few days early to make sure the facility and equipment is ready for us to perform our job.

There are other groups coming to do charitable work also and there may be some changes in the equipment status that we may be unaware.

Lately, I am involved with another group called Global Vision. They are a group of ophthalmology. They are helping with cataract surgery and implants on mostly the elderly. What is more important is that they are also working with the Honduran Medical School of Ophthalmology; Global Vision helps these local young ophthalmologists with teaching, equipment and implants. Yesterday, I met a young ophthalmologist who was performing cataract surgery at San Benito Jose. She was working with a scholarship from Global Vision. I was so glad to see that this young ophthalmologist; her whole crew, was made up of Honduran professionals.

This weekend we will have to unpack 2,300 lbs. of medical supplies that we sent last November, please see the pictures. These supplies we got as donations from a hospital from the Coco Beach area. Sometimes the blessings are overwhelming, but we definitely have a use for all the supplies. Following this shipment, we sent another one for Christmas of 1,800

lbs. This shipment was mostly hospital linens and donations from the Dream Center. It was distributed among the orphanages and San Benito Jose.

While we are here, I am expecting our first shipment from 2024 of 2,300 lbs. of mostly hospital linens, medical supplies and more donations from the Dream Center.

We have mostly the usual crew coming back with four new members. This is a good because it provides consistency to the group.
