# DON'T FORGET BAGS FOR TALBOT HOUSE —

Thank you to all of you who continue to support this ministry! Talbot House does extraordinary things to help the homeless. We are blessed to share in that ministry! Their doors are open to both men and women and they provide meals, shelter, & clothing, and direct them to medical care as needed. We collect offerings of canned goods-meat, vegetables, fruit, soup, paper goodspaper towels, toilet paper, napkins; cleaning supplies; soapdishwashing, personal soap, laundry; toothbrushes & toothpaste. We also collect gently used clothes -free from stains, and have working zippers and buttons. There are especially marked baskets in the mail room at the back of the church to place your offerings. Our pickup day is the second Tuesday of every month. We also have a box on top of the table where you may place unused medicines, empty pill bottles, and unopened bottles of over the counter medicines. Talbot House uses the empty pill bottles to measure out soap and shampoo for the residents. Please remove labels from the empty bottles. Large containers of spices, flour, and sugar are

## From the Pastor.....

#### **Epiphany People**


"To me, though I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given, to preach to the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ, and to bring to light for everyone what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God..." (Ephesians 3:8-9 ESV).

For many years, the slogan of the General Electric corporation was "GE, we bring good things to life." I would get confused, thinking that the slogan should be, "we bring good things to light," since the company made light bulbs at the time. As Christians, we know that life and light are always close at hand. The second verse of *Hark the Herald Angel Sing* contains the line, "Light and life to all He brings." In the Gospel of John Jesus declares himself to be the "Light of the world" (8:12 and 9:5), as well as "the Life" (11:25 and 14:6). In the Epistle for Epiphany quoted above, St. Paul declares that he was to preach to the gentiles (non-Jewish ethnicities) the riches of Christ, and to bring to light for **everyone** God's plan. The word *epiphany* carries with it the sense of shining forth the light, a revelation. We mark the holy day of Epiphany to commemorate the pagan Magi being led by the star to see the child Jesus. We continue to shine forth the light of Christ to all nations in today's world. As we sing in the Nunc Dimittis, Jesus continues to be "A light to lighten the Gentiles." As we are empowered by the Holy Spirit to shine forth the light of Christ to Polk County, we bestow upon our neighbors abundant life. May we be empowered to continue to share God's love in word and deed.

#### Study starting in January: Luther's Small Catechism and Explanation (2017 edition)

From the catalogue description: Written by Martin Luther in 1529, the Small Catechism provides a brief, clear summary of God's Word on the essentials of the Christian faith. In question-and-answer format, it explores the Six Chief Parts of Christian Doctrine and includes daily prayers, a table of duties for Christians in their various callings, and a guide for Christians as they prepare to receive Holy Communion. The Small Catechism itself is a timeless confession of the Faith, applicable to Christian instruction in every age.

An explanation designed to help readers understand and apply Luther's Small Catechism has accompanied editions of the catechism since the early days of Lutheranism. However, in the time since Luther wrote his explanation to the catechism, society, and culture have changed dramatically. The 2017 Explanation presents a lens to faithfully understand God's Word in the midst of changing times—providing a practical guide for living the daily Christian life. With 374 questions and accompanying Scripture references, the new Explanation provides more biblical teaching and devotional aids than ever before. The Bible text included in the Explanation is from the English Standard Version (ESV).

### **Options for Women**

Because Christ Lutheran Church supports life from beginning in the womb to death, each year we support the baby bottle campaign for Options for Women. Options for Women is a crisis pregnancy center in Lakeland with their main office located in south Lakeland. They provide pregnancy testing, counseling, ultrasounds, STD testing, referrals for support, and a starter

layette for babies as needed. Each year we designate a Sunday in January to hand out baby bottles. We then ask for you to fill them with a check or cash in the form of dollars or all of the loose change you have. You will have about three weeks to do this. We want to continue to support LIFE!

Bottles will be available on **Sunday, January 7 and must be returned by Sunday, January 28th**.

#### Central America Missions December 2023

Christ Lutheran, thank you for your support to the Central American Mission during 2023. With your help we were able to accomplish a lot. Our accomplishments continue to grow. The phrase; "the sky is the limit" really applies to this mission. I am already confirmed for three surgical missions to Guatemala and Honduras for 2024. At this point, I am trying to make sure that our logistics will fall into place and in time for each mission. The support to the mission comes from a line item budget in our Church; we are able to expand our work because of individual donations done directly to the Central American mission fund managed through our Church Treasury. Your individual donations go directly to those you intend to help.

The service the surgical groups provide are completely free. The local hospitals are religious base organizations whose interest is to serve those who can not help themselves. They also have a system to screen the patients, so the surgeons can do a final determination. Most of the surgeries we perform are GYN, General, Orthopedic, and Podiatry. I am really proud to be part of these missions, and I thank you for your support.

This month in December we sent another shipment of 1800 lbs. It was to be distributed to

the different Orphanages, girls, boys, and elderly. These orphanages are mostly run by Friars and Nuns. The programs in the orphanages for kids are run in a way that provides safety, and an opportunity to grow and get an education. Most of the time the kids have an opportunity to return to their homes; provided that it is safe to do.

Again, I am grateful for your support to the Central American Mission. Please continue your support with prayers and financial donations. We all have a little part in helping the poorest of the poor.
