DON'T FORGET BAGS FOR TALBOT HOUSE —

Thank you to all of you who continue to support this ministry! Talbot House does extraordinary things to help the homeless. We are blessed to share in that ministry! Their doors are open to both men and women and they provide meals, shelter, & clothing, and direct them to medical care as needed. We collect offerings of canned goods-meat, vegetables, fruit, soup, paper goodspaper towels, toilet paper, napkins; cleaning supplies; soap-dishwashing, personal soap, laundry; toothbrushes & toothpaste. We also collect gently used clothes -free from stains, and have working zippers and buttons. There are especially marked baskets in the mail room at the back of the church to place your offerings. Our pickup day is the second Tuesday of every month. We also have a box on top of the table where you may place unused medicines, empty bottles, and unopened bottles of pill over the counter medicines. Talbot House uses the empty pill bottles to measure out soap and shampoo for the residents. Please remove labels from the empty bottles. Large containers of spices, flour, and sugar are real blessings.

From the Pastor.....

449 O Sacred Head, Now Woundedst. 2

What Thou, my Lord, hast suffered Was all for sinners' gain;

As we contemplate Christ's death on Good Friday, we do so with full awareness of the Law. Jesus got what we deserve. To paraphrase the hymn, Ours were the transgressions, His the deadly pain. Martin Luther in a Good Friday sermon on Isaiah 53:8, said

"...where one thorn pierces Christ, there more than a thousand thorns should pierce thee, yea, eternally should they thus and even more painfully pierce thee. Where one nail is driven through his hands and feet, thou shouldest eternally suffer such and even more painful nails; as will be also visited upon those who, let Christ's sufferings be lost and fruitless as far as they are concerned."

To view the cross properly, we need to see ourselves as who we are: sinners beloved by God. To see God clearly, we need to come to true knowledge of our selves. Luther continues:

"...for the benefit of Christ's sufferings depends almost entirely upon man coming to a true knowledge of himself, and becoming terror-stricken and slain before himself. And where man does not come to this point, the sufferings of Christ have become of no true benefit to him."

This Lententide, I pray that with deep introspection, you may see yourself clearly. And having gained a true knowledge of yourself, you would see Jesus clearly.




