DON'T FORGET BAGS FOR TALBOT HOUSE —

Thank you to all of you who continue to support this ministry! Talbot House does extraordinary things to help the homeless. We are blessed to share in that ministry! Their doors are open to both men and women and they provide meals, shelter, & clothing, and direct them to medical care as needed. We collect offerings of canned goods-meat, vegetables, fruit, soup, paper goodspaper towels, toilet paper, napkins; cleaning supplies; soap-dishwashing, personal soap, laundry; toothbrushes & toothpaste. We also collect gently used clothes -free from stains, and have working zippers and buttons. There are especially marked baskets in the mail room at the back of the church to place your offerings. Our pickup day is the second Tuesday of every month. We also have a box on top of the table where you may place unused medicines, empty pill bottles, and unopened bottles of over the counter medicines. Talbot House uses the empty pill bottles to measure out soap and shampoo for the residents. Please remove labels from the empty bottles. Large containers of spices, flour, and sugar are real blessings.



For the month of February, our actual performance is at a negative \$4,170, compared to the budgeted amounts. For YTD, our actual performance is at a positive \$7,090, compared to budgeted amounts. There were no noteworthy income or expense items available this month. Our undedicated bank assets are \$81,511. The Stewardship Report shows that our total church income is about 38.5% higher this year than it was at the end of February 2023.

Central American Missions April 2024



As of this writing; I am on my way to Guatemala on my third mission so far for 2024. My wife and I are going with a medical group based in Wisconsin. We serve mostly Mayan communities. They all come from far away places in pickup trucks and more likely some of them do some hours of walking before they reach the trucks. The hospital is located in San Lucas Toliman; one of the twelve communities located around Lake Atitlan, in Guatemala. These communities are named after the twelve apostles.

We will be providing surgeries in podiatry and orthopedic. Unfortunately, we see a lot of cases of club foot in children and some adults. There are also some cases of amniotic band amputations; these cases are typical in the Mayan population. It is suspected that the mothers suffered malnutrition during pregnancy and that is the reason for amniotic bands. It is said that some Mayan mothers starve themselves during pregnancy to have small children.


This is a very exceptional mission. The Mayan Indians in this area speak nineteen different dialects; sometimes we have to have a translator for the translator. The cases we deal with here are very challenging, but we also have very talented podiatrist and pediatric orthopedic surgeons. I feel privileged to work with this surgical group.
