DON'T FORGET BAGS FOR TALBOT HOUSE —

Thank you to all of you who continue to support this ministry! Talbot House does extraordinary things to help the homeless. We are blessed to share in that ministry! Their doors are open to both men and women and they provide meals, shelter, & clothing, and direct them to medical care as needed. We collect offerings of canned goods-meat, vegetables, fruit, soup, paper goodspaper towels, toilet paper, napkins; cleaning supplies; soap-dishwashing, personal soap, laundry; toothbrushes & toothpaste. We also collect gently used clothes -free from stains, and have working zippers and buttons. There are especially marked baskets in the mail room at the back of the church to place your offerings. Our pickup day is the second Tuesday of every month. We also have a box on top of the table where you may place unused medicines, empty bottles, and unopened bottles of over the counter medicines. Talbot House uses the empty pill bottles to measure out soap and shampoo for the residents. Please remove labels from the empty bottles. Large containers of spices, flour, and sugar are real blessings.



From the Pastor.....

The apparent disgrace that reveals true grace

For the sake of this very strife and struggle [with Herod], by which the wise men accepted the word of the prophet and followed it into such wild, unnatural appearance of a royal birth, God comforted and strengthened them by this star which went before them more friendly than before. Now they see it near, it is their guide, and they have an assurance which needs no further question. Before it was far from them, and they were not certain where they would find the king. So it is always with the Christian, after affliction has been endured God becomes more dear to him and is so near and so distinctly seen that man not only forgets anxiety and affliction, but has a desire for greater affliction. He gradually becomes so strong that he does not take offense at the insignificant, unattractive life of Christ. For now he experiences and realizes that to find Christ it must appear as though he found nothing but disgrace. (Martin Luther, Sermon on Epiphany, 1522)

The Magi endured much in their pursuit to see Jesus. They traveled through strange lands following a strange sign. They went first to Jerusalem, to Herod, who held the seat of power, thinking that Jerusalem would be the place where the king would be found. It is curious that the star did not lead directly to Jesus. Instead, there was a detour that led to intrigue. A bump in the road. Herod wanted to use the magi to find Jesus in order to kill him; there couldn't be pretenders to Herod's throne, at least from Herod's perspective. Instead of finding the boy Jesus, the Word made flesh, presumably they encountered the Word of the prophecy of Micah in Herod's hearing.

"'And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel.'" (Matthew 2:6 ESV)



Once they departed Herod, taking direction from the prophetic word, the star also unmistakably led them to Jesus. He wasn't much to look at, being born to a virgin of humble estate, but he was in truth King of heaven and earth. As Luther remarked, "it must appear as though he found nothing but disgrace." The apparent disgrace of this lowly child masked the grace that He would bestow on Jew and gentile alike, on you and me. As Jesus Continued on page 7

continues to reveal himself in the lowly form of human language, combined with water, bread, and wine, we see Jesus clearly. Each time we receive God's gifts, it is in essence another Epiphany, another time in which God was made manifest. May we all see Jesus clearly!


