DON'T FORGET BAGS FOR TALBOT HOUSE —

Thank you to all of you who continue to support this ministry! Talbot House does extraordinary things to help the homeless. We are blessed to share in that ministry! Their doors are open to both men and women and they provide meals, shelter, & clothing, and direct them to medical care as needed. We collect offerings of canned goods-meat, vegetables, fruit, soup, paper goodspaper towels, toilet paper, napkins; cleaning supplies; soap-dishwashing, personal soap, laundry; toothbrushes & toothpaste. We also collect gently used clothes -free from stains, and have working zippers and buttons. There are especially marked baskets in the mail room at the back of the church to place your offerings. Our pickup day is the second Tuesday of every month. We also have a box on top of the table where you may place unused medicines, empty bottles, and unopened bottles of pill over the counter medicines. Talbot House uses the empty pill bottles to measure out soap and shampoo for the residents. Please remove labels from the empty bottles. Large containers of spices, flour, and sugar are real blessings.



From the Pastor.....

Good Friday and Easter

Some folks love Easter Sunday, but they turn away from God Friday. Every Good Friday, we hear again of Jesus' bitter sufferings and death. We hear the shouts, "Crucify Him!" We hear of him being humiliated, stripped, and made to wear the crown of thorns. We hear the crowd's declaration that "His blood be upon us and upon our children." We hear of Him being brutally flogged, leaving his back raw and bleeding. We hear of Jesus being affixed to the cross. We hear Jesus' words, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." Like rubberneckers passing a grizzly scene on a highway, we imagine in our mind's eye all the trauma that happened to Jesus.

This focus on Jesus death is well and good. But we miss something if we forget that He did it all FOR YOU.

As we reflect on Jesus' death, we also reflect on ourselves: our sin, our unworthiness, our selfishness, our brokenness.

Martin Luther wrote, "The benefit of Christ's sufferings depends almost entirely upon man coming to a true knowledge of himself, and becoming terror-stricken and slain before himself. And where man does not come to this point, the sufferings of Christ have become of no true benefit to him." (A Sermon on how to Contemplate Christ's Holy Sufferings, 1519).

I pray that self-reflection leads you to call out to the Lord. I pray that you not only reflect on Jesus but reflect upon your old sinful self.

By reflecting upon yourself as you reflect on Jesus' suffering and death, the joy of Christ's Easter Resurrection is all the sweeter. Jesus' emergence from the tomb announces that you are forgiven, that your sins are atoned for, and that you are free. After the Law does it's bitter and painful work within us, the Easter Gospel gives us new life and new beings.

Christian Education

If you remember from last month, I shared with you my format using the Portals of Prayers. I hope you are enjoying and growing in your faith using this devotional guide. Don't forget all the prayers in the back, especially the ones on each day of the week as well as Luther's Morning and Evening prayers in the front of the guide.

This month, I would like to share my other devotional guide, Today's Light, published also by Concordia Publishing House, St. Louis, MO. For many years I used a devotional study, the Daily Walk. Each year I read through the entire Bible. Sad to say Walk Thru the Bible discontinued the publication of this devotional guide. I remembered Concordia had a guide going through the Bible in two years. This is now what I use along with my Portals of Prayers. Each day you usually read 2-3 chapters of God's Word. Right now I am reading the Book of Ezekiel. On each page you will see this outline. First, you will "Get the Big Picture" of your required reading. This will give you a helpful overview of the day's reading. Secondly, will be the devotion of your reading called "Sharpen Your Focus." This helps you clearly understand the passage and see its meaning for your life. Finally, there will be at the bottom of your devotion a section called "Zoom In." This part of your devotion highlights interesting parts of the text you may not notice at first glance and gives practical suggestions for living according to God's Word daily. In addition there is also a reading from the Psalms which matches the content for the day and a reading from Proverbs each day. You will read the Book of Proverbs in one year. On the weekends you will read only one devotion.

In addition there is also a marking guide you can use in your study: Praise, yellow; Forgiveness, red; God's promises, blue; Ways to love God and others, orange; Giving, pink; Jesus' return, purple; The Church, green; and Sin and Satan, gray. I don't use the colors but it is a suggestion you can use in your reading of God's Word. For Old Testament promises of the Savior to come, mark it with a cross, and what God says about your heart, mark it with a heart.

After each month there is a quiz for you to take. It is multiple choice. The answers are at the bottom of the quiz.

Finally at the back of the guide there is a section on Prayer. Each day they give you suggestions on who to pray for and then you can conclude with the Collect appropriate for the season of the Church Year.







Central America Missions March, 2025


