
Savior, Servant, Friend Services for Lent March 26, 2025

Confession and Forgiveness

- P Sin threatens to separate us from the comfort we have in our Savior, Servant, Friend, Jesus.
- Lord Jesus, hear us now as we confess our sins to you.

- P We have sought comfort and peace in all the wrong places.
- We have tried to comfort ourselves by our desires and lusts.
- **P** We have failed to comfort others as we should.
- **©** We have torn down and harmed, slandered and lied.
- P We have found no comfort or peace in our sin and shame.
- C Lord, have mercy! Christ, have mercy! Lord, have mercy!

(Please silently reflect on the discomfort of sin and the comforting assurance of Christ's forgiveness.)

- P Comfort, comfort my people, says our God! Our friend Jesus faced the discomfort and pain of the cross in order to forgive us of all our sins. In the stead and by the command of our friend, Jesus Christ, I declare to you the forgiveness of all your sins and the comforting assurance that are set free from sin and shame.
- **©** What a friend we have in Jesus.

P Almighty and everlasting God, as we venture deeper into this Lenten season, draw us into an ever deeper friendship with you. Give us your Holy Spirit so that we can hear your Word, trust in your promises, fix our eyes on the cross, and be comforted by your loving-kindness. We pray this through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Old Testament Reading

Isaiah 51:1-6

Listen to me, you who pursue righteousness, you who seek the Lord: look to the rock from which you were hewn, and to the quarry from which you were dug. Look to Abraham your father and to Sarah who bore you; for he was but one when I called him, that I might bless him and multiply him. For the Lord comforts Zion; he comforts all her waste places and makes her wilderness like Eden, her desert like the garden of the Lord; joy and gladness will be found in her, thanksgiving and the voice of song.

Give attention to me, my people, and give ear to me, my nation; for a law will go out from me, and I will set my justice for a light to the peoples. My righteousness draws near, my salvation has gone out, and my arms will judge the peoples; the coastlands hope for me, and for my arm they wait.
