

## DON'T FORGET BAGS FOR TALBOT HOUSE —

Thank you to all of you who continue to support this ministry! Talbot House does extraordinary things to help the homeless. We are blessed to share in that ministry! Their doors are open to both men and women and they provide meals, shelter & clothing, and direct them to medical care as needed. We collect offerings of canned goods-meat, vegetables, fruit, soup, paper goods-paper towels, toilet paper, napkins; cleaning supplies; dishwashing soap, personal soap, laundry soap; toothbrushes & toothpaste. We also collect gently used clothes -free from stains, and have working zippers and buttons. There are especially marked baskets in the mail room at the back of the church to place your offerings. Our pickup day is the second Tuesday of every month. We also have a box on top of the table where you may place unused medicines, empty pill bottles, and unopened bottles of over the counter medicines. Talbot House uses the empty pill bottles to measure out soap and shampoo for the residents. Please remove labels from the empty bottles. Large containers of spices, flour, and sugar are real blessings.

#### From the Pastor.....

#### What We Believe About God

This is the first in a series of articles about the Augsburg Confession. The Book of Concord is a collection of writings from the time of the Reformation that define what it means to be Lutheran. The three Ecumenical Creeds (Nicene, Apostles, and Athanasian) had been around for centuries and are included because they define in the broadest terms the Christian faith. The other documents included in the Book of Concord were written between 1529 (the catechisms) and 1577 (the Formula of Concord). Missouri Synod pastors subscribe (state they believe, teach, and confess) to the Book of Concord as part of ordination and installation services because it is a correct explanation of key teachings of God's Word. The Augsburg Confession was made by German princes in 1530, and is considered the chief Lutheran Confession.

#### Augsburg Confession Article I: God

[1] Our churches teach with common consent that the decree of the Council of Nicaea about the unity of the divine essence and the three persons is true. [2] It is to be believed without any doubt. God is one divine essence who is eternal, without a body, without parts, of infinite power, wisdom, and goodness. He is the maker and preserver of all things, visible and invisible [Nehemiah 9:6]. [3] Yet there are three persons, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit [Matthew 28:19]. These three persons are of the same essence and power. [4] Our churches use the term person as the Fathers have used it. We use it to signify, not a part or quality in another, but that which subsists of itself....

There is nothing that the Lutherans disagree(d) with the Roman Catholic Church about the doctrine of God. We don't understand how God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit can be three and one at the same time, but we confess it because that is what the Bible teaches. There are lots of false teachings around. Some people falsely believe that God has two parts, light and dark/good and evil, sort of like Yin and Yang of Taoism; God is only good. Some people falsely believe that Jesus only seemed like God, and that a special knowledge is needed to really "get" God. Some people falsely believe that Jesus did not always exist. Some people falsely believe that Jesus and the Father are essentially different beings and cannot be one.

Chances are there are people in your life that think things about God that aren't right. In love and with patience, may the Lord use us to somehow and in someway to give a clearer picture of who God is and what God does as the Father made and continues to remake us, as Jesus bought us back from the devil, and as the Holy Spirit creates and sustains faith in us.

#### A Word from the President

I came across an interesting observation made by Dr. C. C. Alberston once. It said the following: "There are 168 hours in each week. 56 of these hours we spend in sleep. Of the remaining 112 hours, we devote 48 hours to labor and approximately 12 hours to daily meals. That leaves us 52 hours, net, of conscious, active life to devote to any purpose to which we are inclined.

Taking the mindset that God would have us tithe of this free time, 5.2 hours is one tenth of 52. How much of this tithe of time do we devote to religious activity?

If we count an hour for church attendance and an hour for a Bible study each week, we would still have 192 minutes a week which would be enough for nearly a half hour of prayer and Bible reading each week."

From that perspective the excuse, "I don't have enough time," doesn't really fly. What's more likely is that the case is too little planning of the time we have!

As many of us already know, time flies by so quickly. Before you know it, we are in the twilight of our years. Often, it is not until then do we think to ourselves, "I wish I'd spent more time learning about my great God."

While we still have the opportunity let us each choose to use those extra hours that our gracious Lord has allotted to us in study of His Word, furtherment of His kingdom and blessing those God placed in our path.

I pray that God will lead each of you into a deeper connection with Him by taking a deeper dive into Him! May God bless your month ahead with many moments of discovery of His great mercies and love.

#### **Christian Education**

One of the authors I enjoy reading is John Grisham. This past week I finished "The Exchange." A member of this international law firm has been kidnapped. As the book progresses the firm finally finds out how much it will cost them to release the hostage. As you read through the book you will also see other countries helping out with the ransom money. The deadline is getting closer and closer. Will they be able to come up with the money? Will she be released? I will let you read the book to find out what happened.
